About Porch View Dances

Porch View Dances (PVD) is an award-winning community dance festival that engages everyday people as creators, storytellers and performers – many of whom have never danced before. Audience members travel from house to house to see new dance works created with professional choreographers and performed by local families in the front yards, porches and driveways of their own homes.

PVD was designed to celebrate the stories of neighbourhood residents and to bridge the gap between professional art and every day people. Taking dance out of the theatre and in to our daily lives, *Porch View Dances* engages real people, in real spaces, making dance accessible to the families who perform in it, as well as the audience members who come to watch. It is in this way that *PVD* sends the strong and powerful message that art is for everyone.

Perhaps even more significantly, *Porch View Dances* provides an invaluable opportunity for people to connect with their families, friends and community in meaningful ways. Performing families and friends enjoy the precious chance to spend quality time together as they collaboratively work to create and perform their art. Audience members are given an opportunity to get to know their neighbours and community members, as they come together to witness the sharing of personal stories through a unique and moving cultural experience.

PVD has gone National! In addition to performances here in Ottawa, you can catch PVD in Kitchener on June 25-26, back in Toronto on July 13-17 and watch out for something special in Moncton, NB this August!

About Kaeja d'Dance

Kaeja d'Dance is an internationally acclaimed contemporary dance company known for its dynamic choreography, highly successful site specific work ("Best Site Specific Work of 2012" Globe and Mail) and groundbreaking community engagement projects ("I Love Dance Community Award" Canadian Dance Assembly).

With over 140 original works including commissions here and abroad, Karen and Allen Kaeja's signature aesthetic is known for its athletic intensity, sensual articulation and theatrical imagery.

Kaeja's main stage shows are performed bi-annually at Harbourfront Centre (or more recently at the Theatre Centre). Kaeja d'Dance also produces the *Porch View Dances* community dance festival annually in the Annex/Seaton Village community, and has now brought PVD to communities across Ontario, including Ottawa and Kitchener. Kaeja d'Dance recently celebrated its 25th Anniversary Season.

Karen and Allen Kaeja are Co-Artistic Directors of Kaeja d'Dance. Distinguished in 3 encyclopedias including the Canadian Who's Who, they are internationally recognized award-winning choreographers, filmmakers and dancers for stage and film, educators and project instigators. Awards include: the UNESCO Citation for the Year of Culture and Peace; CDA "I Love Dance" Community Award (Porch View Dances); Clifford E. Lee (CND); Bonnie Bird (UK); Paul D. Fleck Fellowship for Innovation; and Moving Pictures Award; and recently the Kathryn Ash Award. They have been nominated or runner-up for: NOW magazine's - Best Local Choreographers and Best Dance Company; CDA Innovation; the Dora Mavor Moore; and NFLD ACE Awards. They have over 200 creations / commissions that have led them to the U.S, India, Mexico, Portugal, Spain, Israel, England and Scandinavia. Creating with people of all ages and identities, they place value on bridging dance, art and the public. Over three decades of refined exploration and collaboration, led them to develop Kaeja sensorial approach to partnering, Kaeja Elevations and Dance on Film for master-classes world-wide.

They are long time faculty members at the School of the Toronto Dance Theatre, Brock and Ryerson Universities, conferences, festivals, institutions and invited artists-in-residence. They have co-developed many site-specific and audience interactive engagement performance strategies over the past 30 years. PVD has now gone national. They just completed a 6-city company tour to Baja, Mexico with upcoming commissions/engagements in the UK, Mexico, Israel, Italy, Vancouver and Moncton. **kaeja.org**

Anik Bouvrette

Anik Bouvrette is a Franco-Ontarian contemporary dance choreographer recognized for the organic and poetic qualities of her work. She is Artistic Director of Tara Luz Danse, a company in residence at Ottawa's Shenkman Arts Centre, which she founded in 2006 after working for more than ten years as an independent artist. Since 1993, her works have been presented across Canada, notably in Ottawa, Vancouver and Sudbury and internationally in Portugal and Spain. Through Tara Luz Danse, Anik Bouvrette devotes herself to creating works for young audiences, namely "Les billes (marbles)" in 2012 and "Les souliers d'Angélie" in 2013. She is currently creating "Les bâtons (sticks)" her new work for young audiences. She also initiates numerous projects in schools and in the community inviting people to deeply experience movement and discover contemporary dance.

Kate Franklin

Kate Franklin is an independent contemporary dance artist based in Vancouver. She collaborates regularly with Choreographers Justine A. Chambers and Meredith Kalaman and companies Tara Cheyenne Performance and Company Vice Versa (Toronto). She enjoys teaching professional-level contemporary dance as well as Yoga and Pilates to anyone who wants to learn.

Renata Soutter

Renata Soutter is a choreographer and dance artist who has dedicated her professional career to socially-engaged dance innovation through creation, performance, community outreach and education. She is Co-Artistic Director of Propeller Dance and her choreographed works for the company have been performed across Canada. She is a Diamond Jubilee recipient for her dance work (2012).

Siôned Watkins

Siôned Watkins began dancing at a young age and performed in her first professional production at the age of 13. After training with Le Groupe De La Place Royale in Ottawa, she received her diploma from Les Ateliers de Danse Moderne de Montréal and began a vibrant professional career. She has danced for many choreographers including Tammy Forsythe, Sarah Williams, Holy Body Tattoo and Bouge De Là. With Danièle Desnoyers' company, Le Carré Des Lombes, Siôned had the opportunity to perform internationally for 10 years and was involved in 5 creations. Also a choreographer, she has choreographed for a number of award winning dance films (Ghostworld and Masques) and recently created a solo (Memory of a Shadow) for composer Jean-Francois Laporte as well as passionately creating for her many dance outreach projects. Also a certified GYROTONIC® and GYROKINESIS® instructor, Siôned is dedicated to sharing contemporary dance and these movement modalities with professionals and students alike. She has taught at École De Danse De Montréal, UQAM, Concordia, Ottawa University, School of Dance and Ottawa Dance Directive. Currently, Siôned is the Education Associate and Teaching Artist for NAC Dance.
